
Warfare Within Us

Annunciation of the Mother of God Byzantine Catholic Parish

In all decisions regarding parish membership and Sacramental life, the pastor exercises the final decision and the confidentiality of the persons involved must be respected.

Parish Membership is determined by three things:

- 1. Being registered in the parish for a sufficient amount of time
- 2. Faithful and consistent participation in the liturgical life of the parish especially on Sundays and Holy days.
- 3. Regular financial support of the parish. Use of offertory envelopes by parish members is required for weekly donations

The Sacred Mysteries of Baptism, Chrismation and Matrimony are available only to those persons who comply with the above requirements of parish membership.

A Biblically based stewardship is part of the vision of Annunciation parish. Parishioners are encouraged to practicing tithing and also to consider Annunciation parish in planned giving such as trust funds, etc.

Couples who are planning to be married at Annunciation parish must be free to be married in the Church and must contact the pastor at least six months prior to their proposed wedding date. Persons applying for annulments of a previous marriage should not set a Church wedding date unless their annulment has been granted.

Couples who are cohabitating or involved in same sex civil unions or so-called same sex "marriages," as well as couples who are contracepting are asked to seek the pastor's help in understanding the Church's teaching and in conforming their lives to the moral teaching of the Church. Such persons cannot receive Holy Communion until their lives are reconciled with the Church.

Parish members entering the hospital or who are home-bound should contact the pastor or parish business office.

Prior to undergoing surgery or going under anesthesia parish members should contact the pastor.

No eulogies or public addresses by laity are permitted during funeral services.

Cremation is permitted but not encouraged. Ashes are not permitted in the church. Funeral services with the body of the deceased in the church must take place prior to cremation. Ashes are to be buried according to the burial rite of the Church. Ashes cannot be scattered or kept in homes.

Appropriate behavior and dress are required for all liturgical services. No audible conversations, or waving across the church. Electronic devices must be turned off. No food, candy, or gum chewing. Dress code is formal and modest for all services.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed every Friday. If this is not possible an equivalent penitential practice is to be observed.





Ss. Peter & Paul - June 29th

On June 29th, the Church both East and West celebrates the Feast of Ss Peter & Paul. One may quite justifiably ask why these two apostles, in particular, are celebrated on the same day. Peter was one of the twelve whereas Paul was not. From the Biblical evidence that we have, we know that Peter's ministerial outlook was very different from Paul's.

Theologically speaking, the reason why the feast day of these two apostles was combined into one was to show that even though their ministerial vision was not the same, yet both were necessary and even complemented each other. Even though the apostle Paul was not one of the twelve, he would claim, nevertheless that his ministry was

considered equal if not superior to those ministers who has been appointed by Christ during His early ministry since he had suffered so much for Christ. Peter and Paul were both martyred in Rome under Emperor Nero in the year 87.

While we celebrate the lives of most of the saints on the day of their deaths, or rather on the day that they entered into the life to come, we only celebrate three birthdays in the church calendar: the birth of Our Lord, of His blessed Mother, and of St. John the Baptist. Celebrating the gift of life, the goodness of life, indeed the sanctity of life, the Church also celebrates the conceptions of Our Lord and His Mother.

St John the Baptist's life reminds us of the many wondrous ways that God works to prepare His people and bring about our salvation, our return to Him, there are also some very important lessons which we need to draw from John's life. John was sent to prepare that way for people to return to God. This is also the vocation of every Christian; even as we work towards our own salvation, we must help to show others the way. We must work to make the way clear amidst life's confusions and provide loving assistance along the way. Then John also reminds us all of the tremendous importance of repentance. We cannot be reconciled with God, have communion with God, or expect salvation without a profound, continual change of heart and mind. Every day we need to turn from sin and death, from self-centeredness, from placing ourselves first. We need to see ourselves as we are and be truly sorry, desiring to make things right. Then we may return to God, acknowledging our need for Him, trusting in Him, following Him. And finally, we should work to echo John as he said of Jesus, "he must increase but I must decrease." Always - always we must work to set ourselves aside and place God first - to know His will, to walk in His ways, to give Him the glory, to serve Him in all we do. St. John the Baptist still works today to prepare the way for the Lord - every time we remember his words, remember his life, remember his example, and strive to follow. Holy John the Baptist, pray for us.


