Learn the art of making Prosphora (Communion Bread). This will be a hands on experience where you will help to make the bread that will eventually become the Body of Christ!



## Explanation of Lenten practices in the Byzantine Church

### The 40 Days

Byzantine Lent begins on the Sunday evening (which begins Monday) before what in the Latin Church would be Ash Wednesday. The forty days of Lent are counted continuously including Saturday and Sunday from Monday up until Great Week (Holy Week). Great Week is a separate penitential week in itself.

#### Great Canon of St. Andrew of Crete

This is a Matins service that is usually celebrated in the evening during the first week of Lent. Through poetic and poignant verses the Great Canon takes us through the entire Bible denoting instances of sin, repentance and redemption. When this service is celebrated in its entirety on the Thursday of the fifth week of Lent, the story of St. Mary of Egypt is read.

### **Pre-Sanctified Liturgy**

Since the Divine Liturgy has a strong Resurrectional element, the Byzantine tradition abstains from celebrating the Divine Liturgy during the weekdays of Lent. However, since the Eucharist is essential to our spirituality, the Byzantine tradition celebrates the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts where we receive Eucharist that had already been consecrated during the prior Saturday or Sunday Divine Liturgies.

#### **Prostration**

The posture of repentance in which our entire body bows to the ground.

#### **FASTING "REGULATIONS"**

#### **STRICT ABSTINENCE**

The law of strict abstinence forbids the use of meat, eggs and dairy products or any of their byproducts. *All faithful adults, who receive Eucharist, are obliged to observe strict abstinence* on the first day of the Great Fast (Monday 3/3), on Great and Holy Friday as well as all day on Holy Saturday, until midnight. The traditional observance of strict abstinence in the Byzantine Catholic Church is observed for the entire 40 days of Lent.

This 40 Day observance is voluntary.


#### SIMPLE ABSTINENCE

The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat or meat byproducts, permitting the use of eggs and dairy products. All faithful adults, who receive Eucharist, are <u>obliged</u> to observe simple abstinence on all Wednesdays and Fridays during the Great Fast.

#### THOSE WHO ARE EXEMPT FROM THE FASTING REGULATIONS

Expectant and nursing mothers, infants, those with serious health conditions, and those under physicians orders are exempt from the laws of strict abstinence.
